Sunday, October 5th 2008 (2:30 PM)

An internationally published and full-time professional Astrologer, Jackie Slevin M.A., C.A. She was the Conference coordinator of NCGR Education Conferences in Hartford in 2001 and Minneapolis in 2003. A graduate of Classical Studies in Horary, she

was a Track Coordinator at UAC 1995 and a member of the UAC 2002 Education Committee. She has served on the Board of New Jersey NCGR since 1983 and is currently a member of the NCGR Board of Examiners. She is author of *Finding Success in the Horoscope*, published in May, 2008.

IMPORTANT: Please note that this meeting is on the fourth Sunday of the month, due to the fact that – at this late date – it was the only Sunday available at the Plainsboro Library for a meeting room.

Ken Negus and Valerie Vaughan, “Johannes Kepler: Seventeenth-Century Founder of Modern Astrology.” These speakers are the author and the editor/commentator, resp., of *Kepler's Astrology: the Baby, the Bath Water and the Third Man in the Middle*, (which appeared early in 2008). The greater portion of this book consists of Ken's translations of *Tertius Interveniens* (Third Party Intervening) and some other shorter astrological texts by Kepler. The remainder consists of voluminous commentary and notes by Valerie.

It can be argued that Kepler, a universal genius, played the major role in the further development of astrology after the seventeenth century. He is, however, known primarily as the astronomer who discovered the three primary laws of planetary motion. But in our scientific age – which denies any significant historical role played by Kepler's or anyone else's astrology – little attention is

given to his several substantial treatises on the subject (outside astrological publications), their importance rejected, and even shamefully misinterpreted by scientific commentators.

The book by Negus and Vaughan presents mainly the text of Kepler's longest and most profound astrological treatise, along with Vaughan's thorough analysis and commentary that offers more than sufficient evidence to disprove the frequent assertion that Kepler practiced astrology only to earn money, and therefore it could not be taken seriously. In her analyses, she points out such things as how he favorably compares astrology with the science of medicine; meaningfully explains aspects; uses astrological weather prediction; dealt with matters that cannot be predicted; and much more.

The meeting will take place at the usual time (2:30 PM), and at our new location at the Plainsboro Public Library.

1: Take Scudders Mill Road exit from either north or southbound lanes. Both exits will automatically funnel into Scudders Mill Road heading East.
